Overview

The West Carleton Club (WCARC) experienced another dynamic and productive year in 2024. The Club's efforts included advancements in technical projects, increased community engagement, and successful participation in amateur radio contests. While challenges were met along the way, the commitment of our members ensured continued growth and achievement.

Key Accomplishments

1. Beacon Upgrades and Maintenance:

- The Club's 50, 144, 222, 432, 903 and 1296 MHz Beacons at the Diefenbunker site, continued to perform reliably throughout the year. Additional fine-tuning and updates were carried out by Bert (VE2ZAZ) and Nick (VE3OWV), ensuring optimal performance.

2. Community and Club Visibility:

- Participation in regional ham shows and festivals remained a priority. The WCARC booth at the Carp Hamfest in September drew significant interest, supported by an engaging demonstration of his new 10 GHz Acquisition by Mike (VA3TEC). - MAD Days are here! (Microwave Activity Days) Fun was had all around during the few events that were held at the top of the Diefenbunker foot hill. One memorial event was in the extreme heat of the summer weather, in August. We got a few 10 GHz contacts, both direct and through rain scatter. - Member name badges continued as a popular initiative, with a new order distributed by June.
- Revision of the Club bylaws to comply with the Non-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA) of the Ontario Government. With the impending rule changes, members of the Club really stepped up to the plate to finalize these new changes. The Club held a Special Members Meeting on August 3rd to approve the revised bylaws. As a result, the Club no longer has a constitution, but only bylaws, as per ONCA. I would like to identify 2 key people for this to happen, Norman Siemens VE3NPP and Bertrand VE2ZAZ. - The Club members met twice for informal Saturday morning breakfasts, prior to the April and August MAD days.
- Glenn VE3XRA carried on hosting the Club-sponsored Upper Frequencies SSB net on Tuesdays at 9 pm on 144.250MHz USB. Thanks Glenn!

3. Contest Participation.

- June VHF Contest: Another successful WCARC Club operated from its preferred Kinburn location, achieving a score of 62,061 points with over 258 QSOs and 151 multipliers. What's was very interesting to me was Bert was able to make a 376 km 10 GHz contact with Kevin VE3KH using his portable narrow band station. Here are some setup photo's of the event. 
4. Membership and Engagement
