




Dates/Times


- Setup starts 1400 Friday 23 June

Category & Callsigns

- Category 2A (Two Alpha)
- Callsigns:
 - Main stations: VE3LCA(Victor Echo Three Lima Charlie Alpha)
 - GOTA station: VE3WCC(Victor Echo Three Whiskey Charlie Charlie)

Field Day Categories


- Number indicates # of HF stations.
- Letter indicates source of power and operators:
 - A: Club or Non-Club portable, emergency power
 - B: 1 or 2 person portable, emergency power
 - C: Mobile stations (includes Aeronautical and Maritime Mobile)
 - D: Home stations, normal power
 - E: Home stations, emergency power
 - F: Emergency Operations Centers

Rules

- Only 2 HF signals plus GOTA station, satellite station and VHF/UHF station
- Max 150 watts
- No WARC bands
- Can't operate and later work us from home
- No repeaters allowed
- Each phone, cw and digital band segment considered a separate band
- May work a station once per band

Scoring

- QSO points:
 - Phone: 1 Point
 - CW: 2 Points
 - Digital: 2 Points
- Power Multiplier: Less than 150 watts, multiply QSO Points by two.
- Add Bonus points



Demonstration Modes

- Winlink 2000 Norm Hagan, VE3VY
- APRS Brad Smith, VE3BSM
- Radio Direction Finding Al Penney, VO1NO



Winlink will be demonstrated in Norm's RV all weekend. APRS will set up in main building Saturday afternoon. RDF will take place near the VHF/UHF station whenever 6 meters is not open!

Get On The Air Station

- "Extra" HF station for:
 - Amateurs without HF privileges.
 - "Inactive" HF Amateurs.
 - Unlicensed "Hams to Be"!
- Al VA3KAI is the Control Operator.
 - * A list of all GOTA operators must be sent with the Field Day submission.

Get On The Air Station

- Same exchange, but different callsign (VE3WCC)
- When an operator reached 50 QSOs, receive 50 bonus points
- When an operator reached 100 QSOs, receive 100 bonus points
- If coached, double these bonus points
- No partial credit
- Max 500 QSOs
- Al VA3KAI is the coach!

Youth Participation

- 20 point bonus for every operator under 18 who makes at least one QSO
- Maximum 100 points

Food!

- ????? will coordinate food for Field Day
- Meals as follows:
 - Lunch Saturday
 - Supper Saturday (potluck)
 - Breakfast Sunday (free to overnight operators)
 - Lunch Sunday at noon
- Will have a BBQ on site (Need someone to bring one to the site – any volunteers?)

Food!

- Will be a nominal charge to offset expenses
- ????? will require help please give him/her a hand!
- Tables and chairs available onsite
- Need someone to coordinate food services!

Publicity

- Media Release will be sent to all newspapers, TV and radio stations
- Media will be invited to site Saturday PM
- Critical we tell the public what we do!
- Publicity table
- Visitors' logbook

Message we want to send:

- Amateur Radio is a vital service with a long history of assisting in emergencies
- We are the only failsafe communications network
- We get vital messages through when everything else has failed
- Ottawa's proposed by-laws and restrictive covenants threaten the future of this service

Safety

- Safety is Paramount!
- Recommended safety equipment:
 - Work gloves
 - Hard hats
 - Sturdy boots
 - Sunhat and sunblock
 - Water bottle





Lightning

- Lightning kills 73 North Americans annually
- Our site high and clear caution required!
- We will follow "30-30" rule
- Safe area is inside metal vehicle
- What to do if about to be struck...
- What to do if someone is struck...

Fire Safety

- No smoking in tents or near generators
- Stop generators before refueling
- Fire extinguishers near generators, cooking location and operating positions
- Bring shovels in case of grass fire

Electrical Safety

- Proper extension cords
- Waterproof all connections
- Kill power before troubleshooting
- Use proper grounds
- RF safety
- Don't stick tongue in light socket while standing in puddle during an electrical storm

Tower Safety

- Proper equipment a must
- Use caution putting up towers
- Don't poke an eye on an antenna
- Ensure guys are securely anchored
- Use marking tape to indicate guys
- NO Vehicles allowed near towers
- If necessary, let tower fall but you get out of way!

Volunteers Required!

- Setup Friday afternoon / Saturday morning
- Operating Saturday noon to Sunday noon
- Teardown Sunday noon
- Tour guides / Ambassadors all weekend
- Cooking and cleanup
- Photographers

Operating Notes

28.050.00 (a)##

- Keep an eye on 10 and 15M
- Listen to bands before Field Day
- Once contact made on HF band, must stay on same band for at least 15 minutes
- Read rules carefully
- Practice using logging program beforehand
- Ensure computer date & time correct before contest starts!

Operating Notes 2

- On 6M, CW 50.110, SSB 50.125 and up
- On 2M, CW 144.1 up, SSB 144.2 and up
- On 70cm, CW & SSB 432.100 and up
- Don't forget FM (not calling frequencies!)
- Avoid 52.525, 146.52, 446.0 MHz (but operate nearby!)
- Vertical polarization for FM
- Horizontal polarization for CW/SSB
- Grid FN15
